

Position: Adult Basic Education Teacher @ Nanaimo Correctional Centre		
<p>The Adult Basic Education (ABE) Teacher @ Nanaimo Correctional Centre (NCC) provides educational services in a prison setting to adult residents with the objective of obtaining their British Columbia Certificate of Graduation (“Dogwood Diploma”) or Adult Graduation Diploma (BCAGD or “Adult Dogwood”). The ABE @ NCC teacher works in collaboration with school-based team, site based and itinerant staff, medical professionals, community agencies and BC Corrections staff in the delivery of individualized and group instruction, modelling the Professional Standards for BC Educators.</p> <p>About Nanaimo Correctional Centre: Nanaimo Correctional Centre at Brannen Lake is a sentenced facility for most of the adult male residents on Vancouver Island who do not require higher levels of supervision. The centre opened in 1983 as a minimum-security institution and with the addition of a security perimeter fence, was upgraded to a medium-security institution in 1997. A new facility is currently being built on the existing NCC site with a projected opening of 2025. This facility will include the addition of a provincial remand unit as well as a unit for sentenced adult woman.</p>
