## **Position: Indigenous Education Teacher**

Indigenous Education Teachers carry out educational tasks such as establishing learning standards in relation to the curricular competencies and content from BC's Curriculum, identifying educational needs, developing educational programs or activities, promoting indigenous culture and educational philosophies that enhance learning experiences and academic opportunities while modelling the Professional Standards for BC Educators.

## **Functions**

- Prepare instruction of courses for presentation to students as outlined in the BC Curriculum
- Assess students according to NLPS assessment and reporting guidelines as well as Ministry reporting standards
- Communicate student learning in on ongoing, timely and responsive manner according to NLPS assessment and reporting guidelines
- Identify diverse needs within the classroom and provide differentiated instruction according to NLPS Inclusion Policies
- Promote Indigenous culture and educational philosophies and be an advocate and cultural practitioner for Indigenous values and traditions
- Demonstrate leadership in the integration of Indigenous perspectives into instruction preparation
- Assist in the planning and implementation of variety of activities designed to aid academic goals and social and emotional needs of learners
- Collaborate with school-based team (S-BT), itinerant staff, Parents/Guardians, Indigenous communities, specialists, and outside support agencies in the creation of learning structures to support academic and social and emotional needs of learners
- Consult on the design and support staff members in the implementation of projects related to the Aboriginal Education Enhancement Agreement
- May be required to provide instructional supervision to Practicum Students, Education Assistants, Indigenous Culture and Student Support Workers or Responsible Adults
