

**Position: HUL'QUMI'NUM LANGUAGE and CULTURE TEACHER**

The role of the Hul'qumi'num Language and Culture teacher will be to provide a Coast Salish language and culture program based on the newly developed Hulquminum I.R.P. Students will be expected to meet the learning outcomes that have been designed to demonstrate the importance of Hul'qumi'num language learning and the Coast Salish teachings and traditions. The successful candidate will work closely with Aboriginal Education and provide an instructional focus that is inclusive of Snuneymuxw, Chemainus and Snaw-Naw-As First Nations, their teachings, and traditions.
