## Position: TEACHER OF THE DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING

The Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing addresses the effects of hearing loss and language development. In addition, the Teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing would assist in the development of the IEP that addresses the social and vocational needs which arise as a result of the hearing loss and which are known to be significant.
